PRINCIPAL REPORT

Welcome back. Where has the year gone? I hope everyone had a lovely break over the holidays. I know I certainly enjoyed spending precious time with my family. The last term always goes so quickly with so many events already in the calendar. An exciting one for the year 6s, with the final term as primary school students.

There has been some concern around where students are being dropped off in the morning. 


