Coronavirus Update

Thank you everyone for keeping up to date with the Compass notifications regarding everything to do with our current situation. As a government school, we will continue to follow the advice given to us in the 'Operation Guide' that we are sent from the Department of Education and Training. At the time of writing this, we have had 22 of these since the beginning of this year. These Guides provide advice on what the restrictions mean for schools, and what we must implement.

As has been my practice, I will communicate any changes as soon as possible, via Compass, so you have as much notice as possible.

School Grounds 9-3:30 on School Days

Last Friday, we had a number of offsite students who came onto the school grounds between 9am and 3:30pm. We are regularly asking members of the public (adults, teenagers and children) to leave the grounds on school days, during school hours – on Monday we had someone walking their dog use the school as a shortcut from Lindon Strike Court to the Main Road School Crossing entrance, and a car drove up to the middle court at around 10am! Please note, as per government guidelines, the playgrounds and basketball courts are not to be used at the moment. The grounds are definitely not to be accessed by anyone between 9am and 3:30pm unless that person is a staff member, a student in onsite supervision, or completing works on behalf of the school.

Parent-Student-Teacher Interviews

Principal's Passage (continued)

Persistent Mild Symptoms Once School Returns

Some children may have prolonged post-viral symptoms such as a runny nose or cough. They may return to school following a negative COVID-19 test even if they are not completely free of symptoms. They will need a medical certificate from their GP to confirm they are otherwise well or have recovered from their acute illness. Any worsening of symptoms will require review and repeat COVID-19 testing, if considered appropriate by the doctor.

Students with a negative COVID-19 test whose symptoms have completely resolved do not need a medical certificate to return to the school.

Events postponed/cancelled

Unfortunately, due to the current coronavirus situation, we have had to cancel the 2021 School Production. Thank you to everyone who had done their best to get this up and running. We are just as disappointed.

As mentioned in the last Update, we made many plans for the remainder of the term; however, these have needed to be postponed or cancelled. It has been challenging to plan too far in advance. Can I please encourage you to keep Compass notifications on, and to check Compass regularly for updates.
