Academic Achievement

Over the past two years, our staff have been working really hard to improve our school reading program. Whilst our students at Research Primary School generally achieve high NAPLAN Reading results, we wanted to improve the growth that students make from year to year. Each year, NAPLAN provides data to help us measure this growth by measuring the Year 3 to Year 5 growth.

Since the beginning of 2020, our staff have been working with Department of Education and Training (DET) Teaching Partners. They have helped us to analyse our current teaching practice, review and track student data, research highly effective teaching strategies and implement these in the classroom. The results in the 2021 NAPLAN data have shown a huge improvement in student growth for Reading in the past two years. So much so, that a team from DET had Patrick, Fiona and myself present to them the journey we have been through over the past two years to help support other schools to make the same growth. Even with two very disrupted years of learning, it has been so exciting to see how much our students have progressed. We are not at the end of our journey, we are continuing to improve further but we want to say a massive thank you to our staff for continuing to strive to improve for our students and model continued ambition every day.

2022 Grade Structure

As communicated to you last week, parent considerations/requests for 2022 classes has closed. I would now like to confirm with you the following grade structure for 2022, I will announce the teachers for each grade as soon as I can.

Research Primary School will have **7** classes in 2022 comprising of:

2 x Prep classes 2 x 1/2 classes 1 x 3/4 class 1 x 4/5 class 1 x 5/6 class

The class formation process is continuing. We take this process very seriously considering how best to place students to ensure that we can provide the best opportunities we can.

Parent Volunteers and Vaccination Status

As mentioned in previous <u>Updates</u>, any parent volunteers we have will be required to present evidence of their vaccination status. This is a DET policy (link below). We have a number of events coming up that will require parent helpers. If this help is sought by the class teacher, on the day of the event, please come to the office a little earlier so you can QR Code/Sign in, as well as for us to collect the information as described in the box to the right. https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/covid-19-vaccinations-visitors-volunteers/policy When collecting vaccination information from volunteers and visitors working on school sites, the following record keeping requirements apply. Schools must record at least the following information:

- the name of the worker or individual accessing the site
- · their vaccination status
- their vaccine appointment booking (if relevant)
- · who sighted the evidence
- the date the evidence was sighted
- the nature of that evidence that has been provided (for example, COVID-19 vaccine digital certificate, immunisation history statement, or medical exception letter or certificate).

We do not require copies to be sent to us, nor will be asking to take a photocopy.



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Principal's Passage (continued)

COVID-19

It has been incredibly challenging to keep on top of the rapid changes announced by the government, the Department of Education and Training (DET) and the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS).

If we have a case in the future, the school will be required to try and identify the Primary Close Contacts (PCC) and communicate this as quickly as possible to them.

The following is a summary of a matrix sent to me that is to help identify contact and isolation requirements. It is important to note that individual circumstances do need to be taken into consideration.

Unvaccinated, within a classroom sized area or smaller, during case infectious period (48 hours before symptoms appear)	Isolate for 14 days Immediate test and Day 13 test	Will be contacted by phone
Fully vaccinated (2 weeks post 2nd dose) regardless of length of exposure	Isolate 7 days Immediate test and Day 6 test	Will be contacted by phone
Contact with case in large venue (e.g. gym) or outside, more than 1.5 metres distant at all times, less than 2 hours during case infectious period , mask wearing	No isolation requirements	No contact

The information in the last row explains why we are currently limiting class mixing indoors. This could be the difference between one class or multiple classes being required to isolate for 14 days.

It is important to note that the Department of Education incident team will make the decision whether the school is required to close or not. I have heard that in some cases where there is a large number of PCCs to contact, schools are told to close immediately to start the cleaning process and to allow time to contact those that need to be. In other cases, the school community will be notified after the PCCs are contacted. I will communicate to everyone as soon as I am instructed to do so, and the communication is approved by DET.

Student Illness

We have definitely entered hay fever and asthma season and many of the symptoms are similar to COVID-19. Our advice from DET has been to contact you each time these types of symptoms appear and to ask you to keep your child home until symptoms have gone (or COVID test as required). We are still required to call you if these types of symptoms appear, and will ask you to collect your child. If your treating GP confirms that this is not COVID and hay fever, please ask for a letter from them to explain this, it will ensure we won't need to call you in the following days.



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
