Whole School Production – RPS The Eras Tour – Tuesday 7th May, 2024 5/6W have been busy writing the script, rehearsing their parts and practicing their dances for the production. It is certainly shaping up to be an amazing performance. Details about costumes were sent home on Tuesday 23rd April.

ENGLISH The English program focuses on the development and extension of Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening skills and involves the students working both independently and in groups to build upon their individual skills.

Reading

This term, we will continue to read independently to practice reading strategies learnt in class. Students will use a range of student selected and teacher selected texts during this time. In preparation for Independent Reading, students will continue to refine selecting a 'Good Fit' book and build their reading stamina.

The reading strategies we will be focusing on this term are Making Connections, Summarising, Analysing, Inferring, Critiquing, Synthesising and Predicting. All students will have access to Reading Eggspress.

Writing

We have an amazing term ahead using our writing skills in different ways. Our main focus this term is letter and diary writing through their experiences at Sovereign Hill, Research Ridge and researching facts of the Victorian goldrush! The students will continue to explore various ways to improve their writing. For example: using connectives, sentence starters that grab the reader's attention and technical vocabulary specific to early Australia.

Additionally, the year 5/6s will gain further experience in exploring words, phrases and figures of speech to enhance their writing.

Mathematics

Throughout the term, students will engage in daily mathematics sessions, investigating new concepts through differentiated activities that cater to their individual needs and abilities. The areas we will cover this term are: Addition, Subtraction, Time, Mass and Capacity (Measurement). Students will also be provided with opportunities to apply their mathematical knowledge to a variety of situations. Please continue to practice timetables at home.

All students will also have access both at school and at home to Mathletics on-line to support our Numeracy program.

Integrated Studies Eureka! Gold in Victoria:

Our unit this term is **Eureka! Gold in Victoria (Humanities – History, Communication, Civics & Citizenship).** The students will explore the impact of the gold rush on Australian society, economy, and culture. They will learn about the discovery of gold in 1851, the arrival of people from all over the world in the hope of becoming rich and the impact on economic growth and the transformation of many small communities into bustling towns. The students will also gain a deeper understanding of this significant period in Australian history through visiting Sovereign Hill and participating in Research Ridge.

Research Ridge

Research Ridge will be held on **Thursday 23rd May** and the students are excited about this upcoming event. Research Ridge is where the students experience life in the 1850s on the Victorian goldfields. They will be cooking and eating food prepared on open fires. The students will construct their own shelters and provide some form of entertainment. They will be digging for gold and hopefully 'strike it rich!' This is a challenging and exciting unit and many skills are utilised in making the day a fantastic success.

Research Ridge – Parent/Adult Helpers

We are seeking parent/adult helpers:

Home Learning

Home Learning will be handed out on **Friday** and due back on the following **Wednesday**. The aim of home learning is for students to take Personal Responsibility for their learning at home. Parents are asked to encourage their child to establish a Home Learning routine. Home Learning began in week 1.

Specialists Classes

Your child will be participating in the following specialist classes this year:

Art - In Art during Term 2 Year 5/6W will continue working on their mosaic on mesh pieces. In the second half of the term their focus will switch to the art element of space, and they will investigate one-point perspectives.

Physical Education – The Year 5/6 students will begin the term by developing their Aussie Rules football skills. Next, they will move onto preparation for the RPS Athletics Day. As the term draws to a close, the 5/6s will benefit from coach-led soccer sessions.

Library – During library sessions, Year 5/6 students will analyse why an author chooses to tell a story from a particular perspective. We will discuss authors' writing styles, looking at their choice of subject or theme, characterisation, plot development and vocabulary. This is a friendly reminder that library books are on loan for 2 weeks.

Science – In Science this term, we will be studying Geology to learn about how rocks are formed and the natural processes by which they change over time. In our 'Rockin' Around Research' project, students will investigate the type of rocks found at school and in the local area.
