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Family Statements, SSB Money and Term Charges

Family Statements & SSB Money

Family Statements have been sent home.

If you receive a statement, you will see a **credit amount in the** *Amount* **Owing column**, this shows with a small dash (-) in front of the \$ sign. This amount signifies how much SSB you have remaining.

(Some families will see a Cross Country charge of \$15 on their statement. Payment for cross country is via a Compass event and will be credited to your account shortly.)

SSB guidelines state that monies can only be used for incursions, excursions, camps and uniforms and does not include subscriptions or learning experiences. Charges for subscriptions and learning experiences will need to be paid for by families and are listed on Compass under *Course Confirmation/Payments*

Term Charges/Programs & SSB Money

Term charges that are covered by SSB monies are live on COMPASS. We would like families to log into COMPASS to give permission to use their SSB credit via *Events*.

Preps do not have any term charges relating to SSB monies this term.

Term programs – (subscriptions / learning experiences) have been loaded on to COMPASS under *Course Confirmation/Payments*. We would like families to log into COMPASS to make a payment or alternatively pay at the office or via direct deposit. **All** families have charges due for Term Programs.

We have come to the point where some families have fully allocated or are close to fully allocating their SSB monies. A statement will be issued to these families showing outstanding amounts and this amount can be paid directly at the office or via direct deposit through our CBA Account.

Students — late arrival or leaving early

Please remember to **always** sign your child into school, at the office, if they are late in the morning and sign them out of school if they are leaving early. Children's attendance is taken from Compass and reported to the Department of Education, which is a legal obligation. Also unexplained absences will show on your child's report. If you have trouble entering an absence on Compass, please either call or email the office and Carol or Jac will be happy to enter the details for you.

Arriving at school

The school yard is not supervised until 8.45am, unless your child is booked in with OSHClub, for safety reasons, please ensure you do not drop your children off too early.

Enrolling with OSHClub is Free and Highly Recommended

We have an awesome OSHClub that runs before school and after school care here at RPS and it's free to enrol. However, you **must** have your children enrolled to attend, even on a casual or last minute basis. If you are running late to collect your child, the school office is happy to look after your child for a few minutes but if you end up being, say over 15 minutes late, you should arrange to have them sent to OSHClub until you arrive.
